



Corona Community Task Force (91CCTF): Partnering for Success

As part of overall 91 Project community outreach efforts, the Riverside County Transportation Commission (RCTC) has recently launched a new Corona Community Task Force (91CCTF) for the 91 Project. Here are some quick facts about the 91CCTF:

What will the 91CCTF do?

The 91CCTF will provide a forum for the community and 91 Project Team to regularly dialog about upcoming construction activities along the project corridor. Timely, relevant, and factual information will be presented by the 91 Project Team. 91CCTF members will have the opportunity to help guide the development of traffic calming measures and detours, provide insight into community concerns and offer ideas and suggestions for the Project Team's consideration.

Who can be a 91CCTF member?

Residents of Corona, members of the business community along the 91 corridor, commuters who use the 91 corridor, and representatives of community groups active in the 91 Project area were encouraged to apply to be considered to be appointed to the 91CCTF. Interested members of the public returned completed applications to Eliza Echeverria Perez of RCTC by November 16, 2015.

How many 91CCTF members are there?

There are 17 91CCTF members.

How were 91CCTF members selected?

RCTC developed a comprehensive application designed to identify members from many different interest groups and geographic locations along the 91 Project corridor, and a diverse set of skills to bring to the 91CCTF. All prospective 91CCTF members were required to complete the application. The answers to the questionnaire and the dual goals of reaching as broad an audience as possible and having a diverse task force membership guided RCTC in selecting the members of the 91CCTF. All applications received by the deadline were reviewed, and will be kept on file for future vacancies the the 91CCTF.

Will 91CCTF meetings be open to the public?

91CCTF meetings will be open to members of the public wishing to receive current factual information about the 91 project. Public comments will be accepted at 91CCTF meetings.

Where and when will meetings be held?

The first 91CCTF meeting will be held December 10, 2015 from 7-9 PM at the Corona Public Library. At the initial meeting 91CCTF members will determine the schedule of meetings, and information about future meetings will be posted on the 91 Project website

How often will the 91CCTF meet?

RCTC intends that meetings will be held monthly and/or in accordance with 91 Project milestones. Meetings will be scheduled to enable the 91CCTF to provide input into project activities in advance. Information on 91CCTF meetings is available at the 91 Project website.
